- A few postscripts to my 8-16-01 remarks:
 - *Erin Brockovich (DVD) also should have
 - -included an "Academy Award for best actress" note to explain/justify the subject tracing, ACADEMY AWARD FILMS.
 - -been subject-cataloged under SINGLE MOTHERS and WORKING MOTHERS (both subdivided --CALIFORNIA--FICTION), as well as DETERMINATION IN WOMEN--FICTION.
 - *Erin Brockovich (VHS)
 - -lacks both the Academy Award note and consequent tracing
 - -needs the above-cited subject headings plus WOMEN PARALEGALS and ENVIRONMENTAL LAW (both subdived by --CALIFORNIA--FICTION)
 - *K. Monaghan's <u>Fly cheap!</u> (2001) was assigned two subject tracings, but would have been made much more accessible by adding 7 more, all justified/mandated by contents-note data:
 - -Travel agents -- Vocational guidance
 - -Air travel--Costs
 - -Air courier travel
 - -Air travel--Internet resources
 - -Frequent flyer programs
 - -Air passes
 - -Consolidator tickets (Air travel)

(Several descriptors might require local innovation, replete with cn, pn, and cross-references.)

- *Noam Chomsky's Rogue states requires
 - -a clarifying (and searchable) note:

PARTIAL CONTENTS: Crisis in the Balkans. -East Timor retrospective. -"Plan Colombia." -Cuba and the United States government. -Putting on the pressure: Latin America. -Jubilee 2000. -United States and the "challenge of universality."

-more precise and useful subject tracings than the 3 now assigned (AGGRESSION (INTERNATIONAL LAW), INTERVENTION (INTERNATIONAL LAW), and RULE OF LAW), e.g., UNITED STATES-FOREIGN RELATIONS-THIRD WORLD, THIRD WORLD-FOREIGN RELATIONS-UNITED STATES, IMPERIALISM, AMERICAN-THIRD WORLD, and descriptors reflecting the Balkan, East Timor, Colombia, and Jubilee 2000 (Third World debt forgiveness) themes.

- *N. Chomsky's New military humanism: lessons from Kosovo (1999) would be more accurately and findably cataloged with the addition of four subject headings, three title added entries (for the benefit of catalog users who search by "title" but may not recall the exact prime form), and one corporate-name added entry for the traced alternative press:
 - 651 Kosovo, Serbia--Civil War, 1998--Mass media aspects
 - 650 Mass media bias
 - 650 Disinformation in mass media
 - 610 NATO-Serbian operations
 - 710 Common Courage Press
 - 740 Military humanism
 - 740 Lessons from Kosovo
 - 740 Kosovo lessons

- *Rhoda Berenson's Lori: my daughter, wrongfully imprisoned in Peru (2000) would benefit from several more subject tracings and added title entries:

 - 650 Trials (Treason) -- Peru
 - 650 Radical women journalists--Peru
 - 650 Military law--Peru--Cases

- *N. Chomsky's Acts of aggression: policing "rogue states" (1999) represents a severe case of incomplete and unhelpful cataloging, which could be easily remedied by adding two notes, a traced series, three subject headings, and three title added entries:
 - 500 Includes material on Iraqi sanctions.
 - 505 CONTENTS: Apocalypse now, by Edward W. Said. -Rogue states, by Noam Chomsky. -On the fiftieth anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, by Ramsey Clark.
 - 440 Open media pamphlet series
 - 610 Universal Declaration of Human Rights--Compliance
 - 650 Economic sanctions--Iraq
 - 650 Economic sanctions, American-Iraq
 - 740 "Rogue states"
 - 740 "Rogue state" policing
 - 740 Aggressive acts
- *Chomsky's Profit over people: neoliberalism and global order (1999) fails to cite the well-known introduction-writer, does not indicate in either notes or tracings the "globalization" aspects of the work, employs a too-general descriptor (LIBERALISM) when a much more specific form was already available on the Authority File (NEOLIBERALISM), and would be more accessible with another added title entry:
 - 500 Includes material on NAFTA, WTO, and MAI.
 - PARTIAL CONTENTS: Introduction, by Robert W. McChesney.
 -Regimenting the public mind. -Passion for free markets.
 -Zapatista uprising.
 - 650 Neoliberalism /replacing IC-assigned and HCL-accepted "liberalism/
 - 650 Globalization (Economics)
 - 650 Corporate power
 - 610 World Trade Organization
 - 630 Multilateral Agreement on Investment
